

Remembrance Sunday Parade



December Update on the Blackwater Conservation Group

Himalayan Balsum is an aggressive, out-of-control weed infesting our local rivers from Redlynch in the northwest to the Test in the south. This includes the River Blackwater and its tributaries. This wretched weed grows up to 3m in height preventing the growth of native riverside plants resulting in erosion of the river banks.

Conservation groups are being set up to record the worst affected areas. In Wellow a particular problem area has already been identified around the Foxes Lane ford (see the map below). This will need to be cleared next summer.



These local groups will then be organising "pulling-up" days to get rid of it. Although these are big plants they have relatively short roots making them easy to pull out of the damp riverside soil. The best time to do this is during the summer months before the seed capsules explode!
